

September 12th 2023 Members Gathering-Strathfield Golf Club.


At our members meeting in September we welcomed Darren & George and the team from Peninsula Sports.





Arrival Of MG Series ZA Magnette In Australia. 1954.



Left. Front cover from the 1954 Sydney [Australia] Motor Show Catalogue.

Designer of this front cover was striving for the ultra-modern sensational look. Although an Austin Atlantic of the time would have looked at home here. This car show and catalogue make a feature of the new MG Magnette. Previous Year. MG launched the new MG Magnette saloon at the London Motor Show on 16 October 1953. This was a little ambitious as production of 36 cars only commenced in Abingdon sometime in September. In fact, only eight were finished to meet the dead line. Two cars additional to the eight in stock were used as display vehicles at the London show.

Now 70 years Since


It's thought the two cars at the London launch had chassis No ZA501 and ZA 503 respectfully.

Left. Lane's Dealers Brass Plaque.

To my knowledge there was a large import dealership in each Australian state. <u>Small plaque at</u> <u>left was fitted to all MG Series ZA</u> <u>Magnettes sold by Lanes Motors</u>. Screwed to the interior trim panel just forward of the A pillar. Its **Lanes'** unique stock Number [390]. Later plaques are in aluminium and may be on late MG ZAs.









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

Further, it's of note this catalogue is double sided [similar to B5 folded in half] with some coloured plates. If you are an Austin person, the back cover of the catalogue advertises the Austin A40 Somerset as a colour plate.

Arrival Of MG Series ZA Magnette In Australia. 1954. – Continued

P&R Williams Pty Ltd were a large distributor of MG cars [Series ZA and TF] in NSW. Just like Lanes Motors Pty Ltd was in Victoria. The 1954 Motor Show Catalogue indicated above is historically important as on stand 3 of the motor show they feature the exciting new MG Series ZA and MG TF. **Both models had affixed under their bonnet the below 'Lubrication/Advertising' plaque.**



This large aluminium plaque in octagon form was designed to be read. It has a unique colour band. The colour band is distinct from the earlier [Y Type & TD] and later [Magnette and MGA] plaques.

Another NSW distributor/dealer of the MG Series ZA Magnette was R S Ward who also fitted a largish octagonal plaque similar to the P & R Williams Pty Ltd version. Additionally, NSW dealer/distributor Peter Lloyd Ltd also supplied the MG Series Magnette but unsure if any were the Series ZA.

NB. Full series production, of the MG Series ZA and later ZB, only got going in February 1954 from probably chassis No 584 [Remember the first ZA production car was given chassis No 501]

70th Anniversary of the ZA MG Magnette

Designed by Gerald Palmer and inspired by designs from Italy the first Z Magnette was produced in Abington in September 1953, in readiness for the launch date of 16th October in time to coincide with the publication date of the Autocar's eve of Motor Show issue. Only 8 cars were finished and did not include the actual motor show cars. The price was 645 pounds or 615 pounds including purchase tax only 10 pounds dearer than the Y Type.

The press release photos were of the two prototypes that lacked front quarter windows, fog lamps, front bumper overriders and MG badges on the hub caps and had wheels painted body colour instead of silver. Cellulose paint was used and only four paint colours were available, metallic twilight



grey, metallic MG green, maroon and black. The Magnette was the forerunner of modern production techniques having independent front suspension with coil springs, rack and pinion steering and semi-elliptic rear springs and Lockheed hydraulic brakes with ten inch drums.

The engine was a 1500cc B Series with twin inch and a quarter SU carburettas giving a top speed of 80 mph and a 0-50 mph time of 15 seconds. The standing quarter mile was done in just over 22 seconds.

The interior was well furnished with the lower part of the facia panel being bakelite and the top was a metal pressing, both finished to resemble wood, (commonly referred to as a tin top) wood garnish door cappings, leather upholstery and pile carpets.

The car did not display the name Magnette - except on the speedometer or the series designation ZA but there were





MG medallions on the radiator grille, hub caps and a skeleton badge on the bootlid. There were 18,576 ZA Magnettes produced between 1953 and 1956 until the new ZB series started in production. *Peter Baldry*










RV8 to Wollombi

There are bad days at work and there are really bad days!

No one was seriously injured, but nine exotic cars, a BMW 3 Series and an articulated transporter have seen better days after this truck rolled near the Brands Hatch race track, south east of London in the UK on 27th August 2023.

According to reports from local media outlet Kent Live, the transporter overturned shortly before 8:00pm last Wednesday after leaving the circuit. The cars, two Ferrari F430 Spiders, a Lamborghini Aventador, Aston Martin Vantage, Nissan GT-R, Audi R8, Jaguar F-Type Convertible, Mercedes-AMG GT, BMW 3 Series and Bentley Continental GT, were reportedly part of a drive-experience fleet.

The Daily Mail reports the cars were owned and operated by Everyman Racing and were being moved from a day at Brands Hatch to prepare for another event at the Goodwood circuit in southern England, about 130km away.



On its Instagram account, the company praised the performance of the truck driver for avoiding any injury or impact with other road users, and joked it may need to break out the cut-and-polish to help get the cars back on the road.

While the truck itself seems to be heavily damaged, the condition of the cars is largely unknown as most remained strapped to the trailers. However, the Aston Martin looks to have taken significant impact and the Bentley can be seen on its roof some way from the rest of the carnage, hinting at far more serious damage.

The incident occurred on the A20, a major arterial road near the circuit, which was closed for some time while the wreckage was cleared.

Here's hoping the insurance paperwork was up to date.

MGB Returns with V8 & Electric Restomods, Manual Gearbox



The MGB has been brought back to life courtesy of a pair of restomods from UK-based Frontline Cars catering to all crowds as one has a V8 while the other is purely electric. The conventionally powered model goes by the name of "LE60" to mark the original model's 60th anniversary. Only 30 conversions are planned, all of which will get a widened track and body while weighing just 2,473 pounds (1,122 kilograms), or roughly as much as a Mazda MX-5 RF.

At the heart of the Frontline LE60 is a new 4.8-liter Rover V8 engine making 375 horsepower or nearly triple the output offered by the original car. The engine is good for 297 pound-feet (403 Newton-meters) of torgue routed to the rear wheels through a five-speed manual transmission developed by Tremec and a limited-slip differential. The hardware is good for a 0 to 60 mph run in around four seconds.

Riding on 16-inch alloy wheels, the Frontline LE60 has a nearly perfect 50:50 weight distribution and an all-new suspension co-developed with Nitron. Stopping power is provided by upgraded brakes with six-piston front and four-piston rear calipers featuring 310-mm vented discs. We're being told the chassis has been strengthened to cope with the significant power boost over the donor car.

As for the BEE, shown here in GT (coupe) flavor with a roadster also available, it has an electric motor rated at 114 hp and 162 lb-ft (220 Nm) channeled to the rear axle through a manual gearbox. According to Frontline Motors, the electric sports car revs like an ICE (up to 9,000 rpm) with a clutch pedal. It gets its juice from a 40-kWh battery pack that can be fully charged in a little over five hours. At 2,615 lbs (1,186 kg), it's only a bit heavier than the V8 variant, and it too has the weight distributed almost evenly over the axles.

Frontline will have the cars on display on October 8 at the Bicester Heritage Sunday Scramble and it says existing owners will be able to convert their cars to EV power. Founded in 1991 as Frontline Developments before rebranding in 2023, Frontline Cars will kick off deliveries of the LE60, BEE GT coupe, and BEE roadster next year.

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
