

MGCC Presidents Report November 2023

Once again, another club year has come to an end. Returning a small profit of \$4,911.00 for the year. Moving forward, I am confident the club is in a strong financial position. I would like to thank David Milling for taking on the role of treasurer and for the work he has done in briefing the new auditors, updating the corporate and bank contact details and formalising, and streamlining the financial processes. Whilst some of this work fell outside the official financial year, it is worthy of note in this report.

As we moved on from the fallout of COVID-19 in July 2022, some of the official multi-club events were still on hold. Regretfully, All British Day was again one of these events, making it the third year this event has been cancelled. However, thanks to the All British Day Committee for working together to make the event happen in September 2023.

I am pleased to say the regular club events have returned to normal, and I would like to thank the past and present Registrars for the time they put into achieving a quick return to normal.

The board initiated several new "active member" events in response to the problematic social times. I refer to the annual Christmas party, the 60th birthday of the MGB and more recently, the 70th Birthday of the Magnette. Whilst the Magnette celebration was a relatively simple affair, the Christmas party attracted one hundred and fourteen members, and the Sixtieth Birthday of the MGB One hundred and eighty-five members. That the Board appoint a small Committee to develop a mechanism for the production, delivery and costing of a printed hard, printed copy of *Opposite Lock* available to all members who wish to receive the magazine in this format."



To provide a magazine to each member of the club would cost approximately \$ 90 per member or about \$50,000 per year and as our profit for 2023 was only approximately \$4,000, this would require a significant increase in annual fees.

Jim Richardson (previously, a printer) spoke that our option would be to deliver a substantially poorer product to reduce costs, however his option was to produce the very high-quality magazine MG Car Club Ltd was currently delivering.

Voting on the motion:

23 members from the floor, voted for producing and delivering a lower cost magazine

37 members against, with 28 from the floor & eight proxy votes held by Charlie Frew and one by the secretary.

Motion defeated.

Since the Notification of members standing for election to the Board of Directors was less than the required 30 days prior to the AGM, it was agreed to hold an Extraordinary AGM prior to the Christmas Party on the 12/12/2023.

As is always the case, some board members and volunteers have decided to call it a day. Allen Gower has been our assistant treasurer for the past four years. The club has appreciated Allen's diligent work, and we thank him for his service. Shelia Trotman stepped down as Membership Secretary at the end of June. Shelia has been responsible for the implementation of Wild Apricot.

I am sure all members will agree that this new system is making the running of events seamless. We thank Shelia for her dedication to this task and the smooth running of the membership system, especially renewals. In thanking Shelia, we welcome Lynn Calluaud to the role of Membership Secretary. The Board looks forward to working with Lynn in the years to come. Greg Fereday and Alan Heritage stepped down as directors in July after four years on the board. We thank them for their contribution as directors and are grateful for Alan accepting the Librarians role.

It is always a pleasure to welcome club members volunteering for duty and sometimes joining the board. I would especially like to thank Matthew Crawford for joining the board and taking on the Club Secretary Role. As you all know, Matthew has a wealth of MG knowledge, and his board-level participation is much appreciated.

I would also like to thank the rest of the board for their contribution this year, especially Hilary Wren, for her tireless work as editor.

During the last twelve to eighteen months, there has been a push by a small group of members to make available a printed copy of the club's monthly magazine, *Opposite Lock*. By having a cursory glance at the club's financials, members will see that this is impossible under the current membership fee structure. The board's current position regarding the magazine is as follows. The publication is formatted in A4 at no charge by the editor who compiles *Opposite Lock*, if this was to be outsourced it would cost the club about \$2000 per month. Currently it is sent out as a link for members to

download and read. Links to advertisers are embedded in the download, giving members instant access to the advertisers' business. A small number of magazines, approximately 75, are printed off and distributed to the following groups. Advertisers and MG Dealerships to promote the club. Official institutions such as libraries still require a hard copy. Members who either do not have a computer, can't read a computer screen, or find the text too difficult to read are supplied a copy free of charge. To this date, no member with a genuine request has been refused a printed copy. At the AGM, there will be a motion to make the magazine available to all members in hard copy. If this motion is successful, then members will have to pay a separate charge for the printed magazine. This will also mean that those currently receiving the hard copy will be required to pay for it. Currently, the estimate of this charge will be approx \$100 per annum, this is just to cover the costs of the publication. There will be a Running Board coming out leading up to the AGM, and I would like to ask members to weigh up the options and support the sensible approach taken by the board.

The club's AGM will be held on Tuesday 14th November at 7.00 PM.

As I will not be standing for the Board next year, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the board and members of the club for their support and friendship over the last five years. I have enjoyed my time as your President and wish the club all the best for the future.

Extraordinary Meeting AGM MG





Third place photo goes to Hilary Wren of a sky blue



Matthew is a Specialist Anaesthetist, Intensivist & Pain Medicine Specialist at the Prince of Wales and Sydney Children's Hospital in Randwick Sydney. His undergraduate medical degree was obtained from the University of NSW in Sydney in 1975 and his Anaesthesia degree in 1980. He then spent two and a half years at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester Minnesota USA, increasing his anaesthesia expertise and studying the mechanics of High Frequency ventilation in humans.

On his return he obtained his Intensive Care Degree, and subsequently founded the Prince of Wales Pain Clinic and the Sydney Children's Hospital Pain Clinic.

He was granted Specialist qualifications in Pain Medicine with the formation of the Faculty of Pain Medicine within the College of Anaesthesia in 1999.

He has been an examiner for the College of Anaesthesia and the Faculty of Pain Medicine for 27 years and the NSW Regional Director for the College of Anaesthetists for 12 years.

He is currently the Clinical Director of Surgery and Anaesthesia at the Sydney Children's Hospital, Director of the Chronic and Complex Pain Clinic at Sydney Children's Hospital, as well as having an Adult Pain Practice at the Prince of Wales Private Hospital.

He has travelled extensively in South-East Asia, PNG and Africa providing Paediatric Cardiac Anaesthesia and Intensive Care Services. He was awarded the Paul Harris Fellowship by Rotary PNG and The Order of Lughu by the PNG Government in 2009.

He bought his first MG in 1966, an MGY sedan for £35 and following a two-year restoration, it was his daily drive for ten years until it was involved in a major accident and was taken off the road. He was then involved with a number of Mini Cooper S cars which were eventually passed on to his son and eldest daughter, whilst he enjoyed a Ford Laser TX3 Turbo four-wheel drive and a Toyota Celica GT 4.

In 2005 our eldest daughter stated she wanted the Y Type for her wedding car and over a hectic 9 months we got the car back the day before the wedding. Our youngest daughter then decided she wanted a Y Type two door tourer for her wedding, and that restoration was accomplished over two years, and again we got the car back the day before the wedding.

We had by that time also acquired a Four Door Y Type tourer that my third daughter wanted for her wedding, however that took me six years, with needing to have the car certified at each stage by a structural engineer. Over the time I have acquired another Y Type sedan, an MG

2024 CENTENARY MG NATIONAL MEETING

SPORTING EVENTS

OVERVIEW

The 2024 MG National Meeting (Nat Meet) to be held in Tamworth & Gunnedah NSW, over the Easter period (Friday 29th March – Tuesday 2nd April 2024).

National Meeting competitive events will require a Motorsport Australia Speed Licence. Both

competitive and non – competitive events requiring a valid Driver's Licence.

Speed Licence Required: A competitive Lap Dash Event on tarmac at the Tamworth Oakburn Park Motor Sport facility, (adjacent to the Tamworth City Speedway)

Speed Licence Required: A competitive Motorkhana event consisting of three (3) Tests at the nearby Gunnedah Regional Airport tarmac airstrip. The Three Tests will be; MULTIPLE LOOP, STRAIGHT SLALOM & ARROWHEAD (Diagrams below).

State Driver Licence Required: A "Discovery" Run (replacing the Observation Run) - see details below.

State Driver Licence Required: A non – competitive social Kimber Run will also be held at legal road speeds on public roads.

All these events, along with the Concours, will be held under a Motorsport Australia Permit. Competitor Entry documentation will be processed as part of the Nat Meet entry system. Lap Dash and Motorkhana Entrants only: an Entry/Disclaimer Form, Statement of Compliance Form and Self-Scrutiny vehicle inspection & check sheet (based upon the Motorsport Australia document).

NOTE: Nat Meet Entry/Competition Numbers will be allocated via email. Please send request for Entry/Competition numbers to:

A visual vehicle & safety apparel scrutineering inspection will occur at the Nat Meet check-in facility at the Tamworth Regional Entertainment and Conference Centre (TRECC), in South Tamworth between 9am and 3pm on Friday 29th March 24.

Whilst to our knowledge no MG Electric or Hybrid Vehicles have ever entered or tried to enter a MG Nat Meet, it is to be noted that the NSW Centre advises that Electric & Hybrid Vehicles (EV and HEV) can ONLY enter Social and events OTHER than the Motorkhana or Lap Dash at this Nat Meet due to the additional MA training and equipment requirements and cost for track officials and the additional cost of special fire extinguishers as per MA Standing

Requirements. It is also an MA requirement that EV & HEV vehicles owners are required to have a Logbook for speed events, which will not suit most road going car owners!

Competitors (car owners) and competition drivers will need

their Driver Licence, Club Membership card and Motorsport Australia speed licence (if applicable – for Motorkhana and Lap Dash Competition Events) noting NO such MA Licences of any type are available at the Nat Meet. Single Event/Day Licences are no longer available from Motorsport Australia.


Junior Drivers: 12 years - 17 years of age Junior Drivers must hold the appropriate Motorsport Australia Speed licence and Driver Licence/Permit in order to compete. Speed Event: 14 - 16 years of age, or under 17 at the start of the Event, and minimum legal age for a NSW Driver Learner Permit, or equivalent interstate Driver Licence, if participating in the Discovery Run.

Note that MA junior licences will NOT be available at the Nat Meet .

It is envisaged that Two Competition groups consisting of a subset segregation of the Nat Meet Classes will apply with an "early Group - A" and a "later Group – B" to run at the Motorkhana, and the reverse "early Group - B" and a "later Group – A" to run at the Lap Dash to help reduce competitor waiting times. Please refer and read the Supplementary Regulations for each event on the Nat Meet website, and the Instructions for Sporting Forms!

The NSW Centre has requested assistance from two local active sporting clubs familiar with the running of local sporting events at both the nominated event facilities, including canteen facilities or food vendor preparation. It is to be noted that the MGCC of Victoria has also offered their experienced assistance with any additional officials as required, for which MGCC NSW is very grateful.

DISCOVERY RUN (previous Observation Run)

THE RUN

The Discovery Run is 82km in length and takes approximately one hour without stops. It will commence at 09:00hrs and leave from

the Mercure Hotel, winding north east through Tamworth, before heading north west and subsequently south east to end at Tamworth Oakburn Park Raceway. There are a number of causeways along the route, some of which regularly have water running through them. It is advised that you slow down to 30 km/hour or 20 m/hour should you find significant water present

Officials will collect your answer sheets when you arrive at Oakburn Park, and you will be asked a tie breaker question, in case that situation arises. A food van will be present at the site.

Replacing the Observation Run Motorsport Australia (MA) currently regards Touring Assembly or Observation Runs as high-

risk events requiring the need for a Motorsport Australia Official License.

The Discovery Run has people driving to a destination, parking in a safe position, exiting the car and walking to seek answers to set questions. MA has accepted that a State Driver's Licence is

sufficient for this event. Only people registered for the Discovery Run are eligible to receive the questions and be awarded points which could contribute to their club's Nat Meet total.



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Abingdon to Australia via Brescia the story of the most original Magnette



MG experienced unprecedented racing success when the K3 Magnette appeared. A class-winner in the 1933 Mille Miglia, the works put together three improved cars to contend the famous road race in 1934. This is the story of one of those cars, chassis 3016, as driven by Eddie and Joan Hall.

If you were to take a walk around the paddocks of Brooklands in the 1920s and '30s, somewhere among the chatter of drivers, mechanics, officials and enthusiasts, you would have encountered all sorts of accents, both foreign and regional, and among them the bluff Yorkshire strains of E. R. 'Eddie' Hall. Hall, loaded with new money from a successful life in business, first raced at Brooklands in 1923 and enjoyed a very long career lasting into the post-war years. Some of his most notable drives, however, were in 1933 and 1934 and they involved a certain wunderkind from Abingdon.

The MG K3 Magnette, with its 120bhp, Marshall-supercharged, single overhead-cam 1,087cc straight-six and Wilson four-speed preselector gearbox, appeared early in 1933 with the first two prototypes being respectively used for the Monte Carlo Rally and testing on the Mille Miglia course ahead of the race itself. Three improved cars were then produced for the actual Mille Miglia, to be driven by Earl Howe and Hugh Hamilton, George Eyston and Count Lurani, and 'Tim' Birkin and Bernard Rubin. Eyston and Lurani won their class, with the Howe/Hamilton car behind them in second. Between them, the three cars put in the best performance as a team and were thus awarded the Gran Premio Brescia, the Magnette being the first British car to win such an honour.

On the strength of this victory, further K3s went into production. Whitney Straight bought a K3 privately and out-drove Maseratis on their native ground at the Coppa Acerbo, and Tazio Nuvolari ran away to outright victory in the 1933 Ulster TT. A blown and unblown pair was built for the 1934 Le Mans. The blown car retired in an accident with a backmarker, but the unblown car finished a very impressive fourth overall.

Eddie Hall was among those who were very taken

by the Magnette's capabilities and he bought one, thereby being responsible for its début at Brooklands in 1933, in which he finished second in the JCC International Trophy. Later in the year, he stormed to victory in the Brooklands 500-Mile Race with a superb average speed of 106.53mph. These achievements did not go unnoticed by Earl Howe, who was assembling the MG team for the 1934 Mille Miglia.

Abingdon prepared three cars specially for the Mille Miglia, chassis 3015, 3016 and 3017, each bearing consecutive 'JB' number plates. Certain improvements were made over the 1933 Mille Miglia cars, including lower exhausts (the co-drivers in 1933 had been deafened by the noise), rerouted fuel lines with armoured wiring conduits and an additional fog light. Hall and his wife Joan were allocated chassis 3016 - the car you see before you, as it is today - while the others were driven by Howe

and his mechanic Thomas, and Count Lurani and Penn Hughes. Sadly, things didn't go so smoothly this time round. Howe crashed, Hall retired around half-way when a loose core plug resulted in water contaminating his engine oil, and only Lurani finished.

After the race, 3016 was placed on the market through well-known MG dealer University Motors, and sold in May, 1934, to G. W. J. H. Wright, a significant name in the story of the K3 as it was he who drove the prototype in the 1933 Monte Carlo Rally and set a class record at the Mont des Mules hill-climb. He seems to have kept 3016 just for road use, and sold it in 1935 to an Australian enthusiast, Lyster Jackson. He repainted it from its original green to the red it now wears, and enjoyed success in minor competitions, with a win and F.T.D. at the 1936 Victoria S.C.C. Hill Climb and an F.T.D. at the New South Wales Hill Climb later in the year being among his most notable results.

The Magnette was also driven in the 1937 and 1938 Australian Grands Prix, but the second of those is thought to have been its last drive with Jackson, as the engine failed and forced his retirement. Jackson still cared for it, however, and in 1940 fitted an unnumbered replacement cylinder block, which subsequently received a number from the Victoria Police Department, V40009P. Jackson sold it to one Bernie Hunt, who completely overhauled it mechanically, and then in 1947 it was bought by Otto Stone of the Day & Stone garage.

This was when 3016 really came into its own. At 13 years old, it was about to embark on the most active and successful phase of its life. Stone raced it continuously over a 26-year period, tuning and developing it along the way. He fitted a Laystall crankshaft with which 3016 recorded a 117mph top speed, hydraulic brakes and an L-type cylinder block. He would attend hill-climbs and race meetings most weekends during the season, often driving to them with a tank of petrol, swapping his carburetter needle, filling up with methanol for the race and then reverting to petrol to drive home.

Stone sold the car to Phil Vickery in 1974, and he to MG collector Rod Hiley in 1977. It was auctioned in London in 1999 and bought by the English K3 model authority Peter Green, who was impressed by its originality, and it changed hands again for the last time in 2003. Greatly impressed by its originality, the body appears never to have been removed or damaged and, most significantly, 3016 is the only one of the 1934 Mille Miglia cars to retain all its original special equipment - the low pipes, armoured fuel lines and auxiliary fog light. The Victoria Police-stamped K3 cylinder block still accompanied it, so the present owner went to work repairing, rebuilding and reinstalling it, and the result, as many marque authorities will tell you, is "the most correct and original" K3 Magnette still in existence.
