son Clive.



Magnette Run to Nepean Dam Sunday the 5th May







Tamworth National Meeting Concours

I have never seen such a big mischievous grin on Ros Bastian's face as she approached me at our Sunday evening dinner in Tamworth. Um, this looks like I could be in trouble.

"I've been waiting years to do this to you" were her words. "Finally, I get the opportunity to tap you on the shoulder to do something. What a role reversal". "Congratulations, you get to write an article on the Concours for *Opposite Lock*". I had no time to plead my case before she had run off to congratulate another unsuspecting club member on their volunteering to write an article on another aspect of the Natmeet.

Fair play Ros, but you could have at least encouraged me by providing a glass of nice red!

The primary organising committee for the Concours comprised Stuart Ratcliff & Andy Leondiou. They made a couple of ventures to Tamworth scoping out various possible locations. Initial agreement with the local Council was for an area known as Bicentennial Park. Site measurements were made & a concept layout of cars by class completed. All good. Well, it was until a call to Stuart from the Council said that they had plans to undertake a replanting of the park & it would not be available to us over Easter. No panic, just find another location to accommodate some 150 cars & 250 attendees for the day! An alternate location of Gipps Street Sports Fields was scoped out & agreed with Council. Next steps – access suitability, field measurements, preliminary layout plans & agreement that the space could work for us.

It all sounds so easy doesn't it!

As entries were received once registration was opened the fine tuning of the Concours layout progressed. Again, it sounds so easy, doesn't it? The new venue, which was a little bit further away from the city cafes, shops & facilities meant that we had to provide a food van, toilets & tents to accommodate officials for the day as well as shady places for entrants to cool their heels whilst their cars were being judged. No problem for Stuart & Andy, organised without any fanfare.

With the amount of "stuff" to be transported to Tamworth for the Natmeet it was decided the best option was to hire a truck. This was arranged & a team of volunteers assembled at the Club storage facility & then move on to Stuart's workshop to load up the truck with all the paraphernalia such as regalia, medals, trophies, bollards, witches hats, line marking equipment, rocker cover racing track, tools etc (plus some surprises that the Concourse team had up their sleeves).

Eventually we all arrived in Tamworth & a final inspection of the site undertaken on the Thursday. We needed some additional resources from the Council by way of a few tonnes of gravel to smooth out the car entrance to the fields & a dozen extra rubbish bins – the Council were most accommodating in providing same.

Our team of volunteers got busy marking out the fields & allocating classes locations. At the same time our secret Matchbox Display Box commenced construction (see separate article following this from Stuart Jonklaas re the building of the Matchbox).

Display day arrived & with his usual efficiency Stuart had us all at the field (at 5.30am with the field floodlights on of course) to undertake final duties – erection of tents, placing coloured helium balloons around the Concours layout to direct entrants to their appropriate class area once onto the field (this was a great idea & worked very well as we were able to easily direct cars to their correct

locations via a series of coloured balloons & volunteer marshals).

All cars were in place on time & the judges briefing held at 9.30 am. At the briefing all judges were provided with flat caps & old-fashioned dust coats (embroidered of course in honour of the event).

Thanks to Stuart Jonlkaas for arranging these.

Action began & all scoring checked after the judges handed in their score sheets before being passed on to Chris & Wes for entering into the scoring system.

Class winners were called to bring their cars to the front line for the outright class judging (Pre MGA, Post TF, Modern). Class & overall results were published in April *Opposite Lock* and are also on the club website. Congratulations to all entrants & prize winners.

Stuart was also determined to secure sponsorship for the Concours to make this aspect of the National Meeting. He called on some of his personal business suppliers who gladly came to the party. Special thanks go to Action Coaches, Frontline, bplighting & Reckless Brewing. By way of recognition you will have seen some special framed printed mesh banners (some 3.5m x 2.5m) featuring Old No 1, An MGB & RV8, & a new Cyberster that we had made to acknowledge their support.

Stuart & Stuart didn't stop there though. They made approaches to MG Motor & the local MG Dealer to support the event. They were successful in both approaches with the local dealer providing us with two new MG's for our use over the entire Natmeet & MG Motor providing sponsorship \$ for the Concours. MG Motor also engaged their publicity department who sent two representatives to join us at Registration & the Concours. They mixed with & interviewed many of the event attendees as well as taking photos & videos. You may have already seen a small compilation that they have put up on Facebook of our event.

We look forward to working further with MG Motor to promote our historic marque.

All in all a fabulous Concours & event overall. As has been said many times these events rely & are successful only due to the work of our dedicated volunteers. Thanks so much to you all for whatever event you assisted at. He'll be embarrassed I know to read this, but on behalf of the Concours volunteers I want to thank Dom David for providing us with Bacon & Eggs rolls & coffee to keep us going on both the Thursday & Friday of set up 2.

Stuart, Andy & Stuart, so very well done. You have certainly set an extremely high standard on how to run a Concours event with your new initiatives & special touches. A fitting tribute to celebrate 100 years of the Marque & a very big challenge for those running forthcoming Natmeets.

It's just such a pity that the matchbox that took two days to erect took only two hours to dismantle & pack up!!! A great Natmeet was had by all attendees. Truly, The Marque of Friendship. And what a great result by our NSW Club, especially coming second in the Wratten Trophy. For those who represented our Club, well done

& for all of us the challenge now moves to Albury for the 2025 Natmeet where we need to encourage more entrants from NSW for us to bring home the Wratten Trophy which we haven't held since 1998. We can do it. And finally, I look forward to that glass of fine red that you owe me Ros!

















To Build a Matchbox!



A casual phone call from Stuart Ratcliff one sunny afternoon was all it took to instigate the biggest construction exercise since the Hoover Dam. He said, "Have a look at the picture I just sent you and see what you think." Then the words just slipped out of my mouth, "We can build that. Dead easy!!"

And so it began, with pictures and measurements of a set of goal posts some 350 kms away, measured by a trusted measurer. The front of the matchbox measured in at just under 7.5 meters and the scaled height ended up at about 3.3 meters!

The hunt was now on for suitable building materials and after lots of false starts, I decided the sign guy who sign writes all of my coaches needed to have his day spoilt, so I broke the news to him that he needed to print this sign and fix it to something we could erect when it arrived in Tamworth. At this point I left him rocking in the corner in the foetal position sucking his thumb. (He also had to do it "Cheap"). A big shout out to Michael McIvor at Valley Signs and Printing in Grafton – he truly never faltered; he did however think I had finally lost it.

So away we went, mentally working out how this was all going to come together, when another victim arrived on the scene. A mate of mine who overnights with us on his way home to the Gold Coast made his usual comment of "What project have you got for me this trip?"Well, he did not know what he was in for!

We built the platform and ramps for the cars to drive onto, that fit behind the goalposts, in one Saturday morning. It was a huge task due to the weights involved requiring carpentry skill and engineering design which, once built, was then dismantled to a point where we could transport it to Tamworth on a car trailer.

Finally, the day arrived, and the aluminum sign-written Matchbox frame was delivered to our workshop. Well, it was huge! The sign writer had never actually seen it laid out in one piece, as his workshop wasn't big enough.

We then went through the process of making brackets to attach all the pieces together and braces to stiffen the panels and then load it onto the car trailer to get it to Tamworth where the fun started. Little did we know how much more stiffening it would need once we had it up.

Easter Thursday was the day of reckoning. We arrived at the Gipps Street Sporting Complex, then proceeded to put the jigsaw together and attach it to the goalposts. Thank goodness we had a multitude of helpers as a 7.5m x 3.2m sign is not the easiest thing to handle. Then, as soon as we got the whole thing upright, the wind hit us and so did the realisation that we had to brace it, or it would be destroyed. It was also at this point that we discovered the goal posts measured differently at either end, the ground sloped away at the back of the platform and a myriad of other challenges that we did not strike on the lovely level, protected workshop floor!!!

This is where the Army of very skilled and capable helpers, stepped in and constructed braces, tied it down with ropes until it was fixed and did the most fabulous job attaching it all to the goalposts. Thank God for cable ties! The final pieces were put in place early on Saturday morning before the Concours and the Matchbox was complete and it looked amazing! We had bravely left the frame up for two nights with lots of visits overnight to make sure it was safe and were very relieved that nobody decided to graffiti or vandalise it.

To say these helpers were amazing would be an understatement. I won't name you all, as you know what happens, but you know who you are, and I hope I thanked you all personally over the weekend. You made Mr Ratcliff's vision come to fruition.

I saw lots and lots of photos being taken, and I am sure Scott Bailey has plenty for you to look at as he took most cars that went through if not all of them.

I hope you enjoyed it as much as I did making it, something that made our Concours that little bit different.



ECONOMIC VALUE STUDY OF

AUSTRALIA'S HISTORICAL VEHICLES SECTOR



This study into the economic value of the Australian motoring enthusiastowned historical vehicle sector was commissioned by the Australian Motoring Heritage Foundation (AMHF) and produced by economic and advisory consultancy, The Mercurius Group (TMG).

It sets out to measure the contribution of the motoring enthusiast-owned historical vehicle sector to the Australian economy in terms of output, value added, jobs and wages/salaries.

Executive Summary

Introduction

This was done in three key steps:

- an analysis of the fleet of Australian motor vehicles to derive an estimate of how many motoring enthusiast-owned historical vehicles are in existence;
- a survey of motoring enthusiast historical vehicle owners (through motoring clubs across Australia) to determine their average annual spend on their historical vehicles; and
- the use of a recognised input-output model of the Australian economy to estimate the impact that direct spending by motoring enthusiast-owned historical vehicle owners has on the economy.

The team at TMG has extensive experience in conducting economic value studies – for major events, industries and assets. Our team has carried out economic evaluations of the Olympic Games, the Ashes cricket tests, the Rugby World Cup, the Australian Casino Association, Sydney Airport, Fox Studios, various transport assets and development projects as well as various industries seeking government support.



About the Australian Motor Heritage Foundation

The Australian Motor Heritage Foundation is dedicated to the preservation of Australia's collective motor knowledge. We are particularly concerned with the historical knowledge that exists in the thousands of motor clubs across Australia but we are equally concerned to preserve our history of motor racing, of motor cycling, of aviation in all its forms and of road haulage by truck or bus.

We have created a library for this express purpose. It is a research library and we are aiming to make our information available in digital form as widely as possible. Our book and magazine collection has tens of thousands of volumes. We also have a substantial and growing collection of audio-visual items that includes photos, brochures, prints, film and videos.

We can assist anyone who has a genuine interest in Australia's motor heritage.

We do not want to be 'just a library' (although that is a significant part of who we are). Rather, we seek to foster social cohesion through public seminars, lectures and informal gatherings which share our passion for motoring with the widest possible audience. Indeed, we will play a role with overseas foundations and heritage centres having similar objectives.

Motor vehicles have always played a key role in the physical, economic, and social development of Australia. We are dedicated to protecting this heritage through operating a library and including by:

- Recording and cataloguing the heritage and history of the use of motor vehicles for transportation and mobility.
- Collecting, preserving, and exhibiting items of significance to this motoring heritage, for the benefit of the community, and making those items available through use including through lending, display and making available for reading (including over the internet).
- 3. Fostering public awareness and interest, through developing seminars, programs, and publications to educate Australians in this heritage.
- 4. Creating an educational resource for universities, TAFE colleges, schools, academics and historians; the Australian nucleus for the automotive and advertising industries, journalists, preservationists and inventive entrepreneurs; to be a resource for Australia's thousands of car clubs and a centre for community engagement.

Summary

Our main conclusions are:

- 1. It is estimated that there are approximately 970,000 motoring enthusiast-owned historical vehicles in Australia out of a total fleet that we estimate is around 21.8m vehicles (4.4%);
- 2. A survey distributed via 834 motoring clubs across Australia was determined as the best way to access and communicate with these historical vehicle owners about how much they spend on their vehicles and related activities each year;
- 3. 6,296 people responded and those people in turn owned 19,200 historical vehicles. This is one of the largest data sets TMG has ever worked with to determine economic value:
- 4. The owners of these vehicles spend, on average, \$10,240 each per vehicle owned around 12.5% more per vehicle (excluding financing costs) than owners of regular vehicle;
- The three largest areas of expenditure (of the 19 surveyed) on motoring enthusiast-owned historical vehicles are mechanical repairs, parts & accessories and bodywork;
- By multiplying the number of motoring enthusiastowned historical vehicles by the average spend estimate derived from the survey, we can deduce the total amount spent in 2022 on motoring enthusiastowned historical vehicles in Australia;

- 7. The motoring enthusiast-owned historical vehicle sector has a much bigger economic footprint than most people imagine. Once all related expenditures are considered, the aggregate direct turnover of the sector is \$9.92b;
- 8. This \$9.92b expenditure also has two "multiplier" or "indirect" impacts on the economy a supply chain effect and a consumption effect. This means that each \$1 spent on an historical vehicle has more than a \$1 overall impact on the economy;
- 9. The total value of expenditure on motoring enthusiast-owned historical vehicles is including direct and indirect effects \$25.2b;
- 10. The impact of motoring-enthusiast owned historical vehicle expenditure creates 78,670 jobs across the country (42,150 direct and 36,520 indirect);
- 11. Those jobs generate \$6.2b in wages and salaries (\$2.8b direct and \$3.4b indirect); and
- 12. The motoring enthusiast-owned historical vehicle sector's value-added (i.e. contribution to Gross Domestic Product) is \$11.4b (\$4.3b direct and \$7.1b indirect).




