

Frank is preparing an attendee spreadsheet with all details and will be sharing it with who are attending. If you have already expressed an interest with Chris Bray at registrar2026natmeet@outlook.com, you will receive ongoing bulletins directly. If not registered, I will be circulating them to all on our email list. When, in late December or early January, SA MGCC issue their invitation to register for the 2026 Nat Meet, I will email or text each of you to get your registration in to them.

As places are limited, we don't want any of us to miss out on attending, as some members did last year.

Transport Options

At our August meeting John O'Neill ,All British Day Coordinator, mentioned that he was considering having his MG TF trucked to Hahndorf for the 2026 Nat Meet and was investigating transport options to and/or from the meeting. John asked if anyone else was interested and a few hands immediately shot up. So, are there any members interested in taking this option?

One disadvantage of trucking your MG is that you will not be able to store any luggage in your car. Car and normal tools only. When we trucked cars to Perth for the 2016 Nat Meet some members used Pack and Send for extra luggage. Usually, Pack and Send is based near the airport as is the CEVA car transport company (if CEVA are used)

Should you be interested please let me and Frank know as a matter of urgency. We will work with John O'Neill with the required numbers (with a possible cost saving in numbers).

On the other hand, members may choose to drive or trailer their MGs. Please advise to see if you wish to know which other members will be traveling on the same days and what stops are planned.

Motorkhana and Speed Events

In recent years, we haven't attracted many members taking part in Motorkhana at Nat Meets, though we do attract a few at the sprint day.

For earlier Nat Meets, the club hired Nirimba Parade Grounds to practice the chosen patterns prior the event. This is an expensive option that requires a good number of members to help it happen. I used to encourage members to set up the various motorkhana patterns in their yard using cans/shoes for the layout. It doesn't need to be full length to assist in learning each pattern. Walking the pattern a number of times certainly assisted in recalling it.

here is no disputing the fact that Britain has an illustrious motoring heritage. Right from the earliest days of the combustion engine our engineers led the way with their ingenuity and established a proud mechanical tradition. Thanks to their skills and vision, British cars became some of the finest vehicles on the road and not just in this country, but throughout the world.

It is sad to reflect upon the immense number of British car manufacturers that are no longer in business, but perhaps their decline has made us treasure those great marques of yesteryear even more. Fortunately, museums and enthusiasts' clubs do a fantastic job of preserving our motoring heritage and their efforts enable us to glimpse these marvellous motors of the past.

A museum filled with gleaming classic, vintage and veteran vehicles is certainly a terrific sight, but nothing beats seeing them in action. First there's the solid, throaty roar of the engine, then there's the shake as the car surges into life filling the air with that wonderfully nostalgic smell of "proper" exhaust smoke! Contrast this with the somewhat sterile and silent experience of driving a modern vehicle and you start to appreciate the magic of old cars.

One British car reaches a significant milestone this year and enthusiasts are planning to celebrate in style. It is 50 years since the launch of the MGB roadster at the Earls Court Motor Show. For many people this open-topped, two-seater, with its long, graceful lines, was — and still is — the ultimate British sports car.

Its classic design and the performance of its four-cylinder engine, with a top speed of 109 mph, were certainly appealing, and so too was its price of £949. It went down a storm with the press

and public alike. *The Motor* magazine described it as "a describul modern sports car...a pleasure to drive", while the verdict of *Motoring News* was "undoubtedly the best all-round conventional sports car on the market...extraordinarily good value".

Three men were instrumental in designing the MGB: Syd Enever, Don Hayter and Jim O'Neill. The majority of the cars rolled off the production lines at MG's famous factory in Abingdon, but in later years some models were assembled from kits in Australia and Ireland.

Perhaps the greatest indication of the MGB's phenomenal popularity was its 18-year production run and the sales that exceeded half-a-million making it the best-selling British made sports car of all time. America proved to be its biggest market and the largest number of MGBs are still to be found across the Atlantic.

Owners from all over the world are currently polishing their paintwork and fine-tuning their engines in preparation for a summer of celebrations. Three major events will be marking this golden anniversary beginning with the MG Car Club's MG Livel at Silverstone (23rd to 24th June), followed by the Silverstone Classic motor racing festival (20th to 22nd July). Finally, on Sunday 23rd September is the MGB 50th Birthday Party at the magnificent Blenheim Palace in Oxfordshire. Organised jointly by the MG Car Club and the MG Owners' Club the party will also raise funds for Macmillan Cancer Support.

Between them the two enthusiasts' clubs have 80,000 members, which gives you some idea of the loyalty that the MG badge inspires. The MG Car Club has an impressive history dating back to 1930 when it was established by the company. Even today it is still based in Abingdon close to where the factory once stood.

John Watson, Chairman of the MG Car Club's MGB Register, explains more about the Blenheim event for which he's anticipating a high attendance. "We believe from the DVLA that there are still 30,000 MGBs around in the UK, and we are planning on ten per cent of these coming to Blenheim in The public of the second of the secon

The public as well as MG enthusiasts are welcome at all of the celebrations and choosing one of Britain's most glorious stately homes as a birthday party venue means that this will be an occasion to remember.

Renowned for its architectural grandeur and as the birthplace of Sir Winston Churchill, Blenheim also has a close association with the MGB as John points out. "Blenheim is only 15 miles

north of Abingdon, the birthplace of the car, and it offers us a great location. It's also where many MGB press shots were taken in the Sixties."

Plans for the party include a timeline display of all MGB models from 1962 to 1980, a reunion for factory workers, interviews with leading drivers, trade stands and a whole host of other activities.

John, who lives in Abingdon-on-Thames, has owned a 1964 MGB for more than 20 years, so how does he describe being in the driving seat? "It is an extremely comfortable car," he says, "and I have travelled to Switzerland in it, as well as other locations throughout the UK and Ireland. It is very easy to drive, and with a smooth four-speed overdrive gearbox will cruise along at 65 mph quite easily, and still give good mpg."

When you ask John what he considers to be the magic of the MGB he replies: "The magic is when you see another MG driver and they wave to you, even the new modern MG cars."

This shared enthusiasm and the everlasting appeal of the car is emphasised when you discover that anniversary events are happening on a worldwide scale. This year, the MGB will be saluted across continents — from Europe to America and Australia to Africa.

If you wanted to buy an original 1962 roadster today, it would set you back considerably more than its launch price. Depending on the car's condition, John says that you'd have to spend between £8,000 and £30,000.

Having been lucky enough to travel as a passenger in an

MGB, I can understand why they inspire such devotion. The thrill of taking to the open road on a summer's day, with the roof down, and the wind in your hair...well, that's pretty special. There is also the enjoyment and pride of travelling in a thoroughbred British car.

Five decades after speeding into view the MGB has lost none of its traditional charm. It has a style and character that is reassuringly British, and perhaps this was one of the many reasons for its incredible success. Created at Abingdon and cherished by the world the MGB has earned its place among motoring legends.

CSCA Round 6 Supersprint -North Druitt Circuit

The Combined Sports Car Association's Jaguar Driver's Club of Australia (JDCA) held its Round 6 at Sydney Motorsport Park on Sunday 19th October 25.

The MGCC Sydney was represented by two of our most experienced drivers in Geoff Pike (Group S MGB) and Gary Maher (Ford Escort MkII running a modern Zetec twin cam engine) with both drivers being Octagons. I was very lucky to miss this Round as, inspite of my plans to enter this supersprint, my MGC had an electrical wiring issue but no luck getting a mobile auto electrician, meaning I had to book my car in to my mechanic, and added a service as well.

The service found shiny metal clinging to the magnet in my sump plug and the culprit turned out to be the timing chain tensioner (after market rubbish!) The timing chain also had some damage as well and was wearing out fast. Had I run in this sprint there was a real chance of a timing chain failure resulting in catastrophic race engine detonation and some very expensive damage to repair. A very lucky miss indeed!

All is well now with a new race tensioner from Dennis Welch race parts (Healey & MGC) in England and a new chain from Germany.

JDCA advised this event will probably be the last round using Dorian timers. (Still in use in Vic, but now not used at One Raceway or SMP anymore). Maybe try to sell your old Dorians to a Victorian?

79 entries were received with a cost break even of 80 entries required.

1 withdrawal refunded. 78 was the final number on Friday, however we had 3 no shows, so we processed 75 cars.

Car 61 had out-of-date seat belts , (so much for a good self check of the car!) so was unable to continue, leaving 74 entrants. Car 161 never recorded a time after mechanical issues on the 1st lap, so there were 73 actually running.

Sessions started at 9.06 am with five groups with a warm clear morning.

During the first couple of sessions, we had 1x flat bed recovery for a lost rear wheel (off an XJ6 Jag with loose wheel nuts!) and 2x flat tows for cars stopped in dangerous places. One breakdown and one spin.

The rest of the day went with no issues getting through 5 completed sessions.

Our Geoff Pike was running his MGB roadster on some sticky Hoosier cross-ply tyres as a time comparison, and easily lead his group each time out, and seemed happy with his times, as Geoff & the MGB ran very strong all day finishing with a Class win and 1m 20.2 best run (35th outright).

Gary Maher had a successful day in his Escort as well with no major issues, and enjoyed his time on the circuit,

with a best time of 1m 25.1 for 60th outright. I had a nice chat with both drivers during the day, while Gary's wife Wendy worked as one of the Meeting Stewards. Both Wendy & Gary have been invaluable volunteer Officials over many years for several car clubs.



It was then JDCA got the entered Jaguars to have a run altogether.

After this interlude we ran the 6th session with combined groups for those who were keen to continue. The maximum number of laps run was 45.

The day was called at 3.47 pm which was still & very hot and getting humid.

The payments for competition numbers was a problem as many drivers only had a credit card and no cash!

- It was suggested that we mention cash payments required in the Supp Regs next year.
- It was also suggested adding Comp Numbers if required, as an additional optional cost on Event Entry, like we currently do for Dorian timers.

A Williams Sports Racer (only weighs around 450kg) running a Hyabusa bike engine, set the fastest time of 1m 06.1 secs , and a Lotus Exige did a quick 1m 08.8 secs. A newcomer was timed at 2m 38.6 secs, so we had quite a range of times again, which is what the CSCA is all about – a good time & opportunity for all drivers, driving at their own speeds! Where are the other MGCC drivers?




